The City of Toronto is hosting several Remembrance Day services across the city on November 8 and 11. Mayor John Tory will deliver greetings and remarks as part of the ceremony at Old City Hall. The Remembrance Day services acknowledge and honour Canadian veterans for their courage and sacrifice while serving their country during times of war, military conflict and peace.

Remembrance Day services will be held on November 11 at the following locations, Old City Hall, Etobicoke Civic Centre, East York Civic Centre, Fort York National Historic Site, Toronto Centre for the Arts (North York service) and York Civic Centre. On Sunday, November 8, a Remembrance Day service will be held at Scarborough Civic Centre beginning at 2 p.m.
