Road Resurfacing on Oakwood Avenue from St. Clair Avenue West to Rogers Road

CLARIFICATION – BUMP-OUTS CONSULTATION PROCESS

An online survey was conducted resulting in 840 responses. The total responses resulted in almost half (49%) of the responses strongly or somewhat in support of curb extensions, and half (50%) strongly or somewhat objecting to curb extensions on both sides, and a 1% neutral response. Included in the responses was a petition submitted in objection of the curb extensions. This survey is different than an official City Poll as residents can respond to this online survey on behalf of other residents.

The information gathered by the online survey was intended to provide Community Council with a snapshot of the views of respondents from December 29, 2015 to January 17, 2016 and is not demographically or statistically representative of the views of the whole population. Other considerations such as the results of the community meetings and other comments from residents were also considered.

A clear majority of support by the community **was not demonstrated** in the survey or at the public meetings, therefore no alterations and modifications to install curb extensions on Oakwood Avenue between Rogers Road and St. Clair Avenue are warranted. The planned resurfacing was approved without the addition of bump-outs by the Etobicoke & York Community Council at its meeting on February 23 2016.

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on Oakwood Avenue from St. Clair Avenue West to Rogers Road this summer (see map on page 2). Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.



Painted road markings will be added to the road to clearly define Oakwood Avenue as a two lane road and to discourage motorists from passing on the right as directed by Community Council.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2016 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

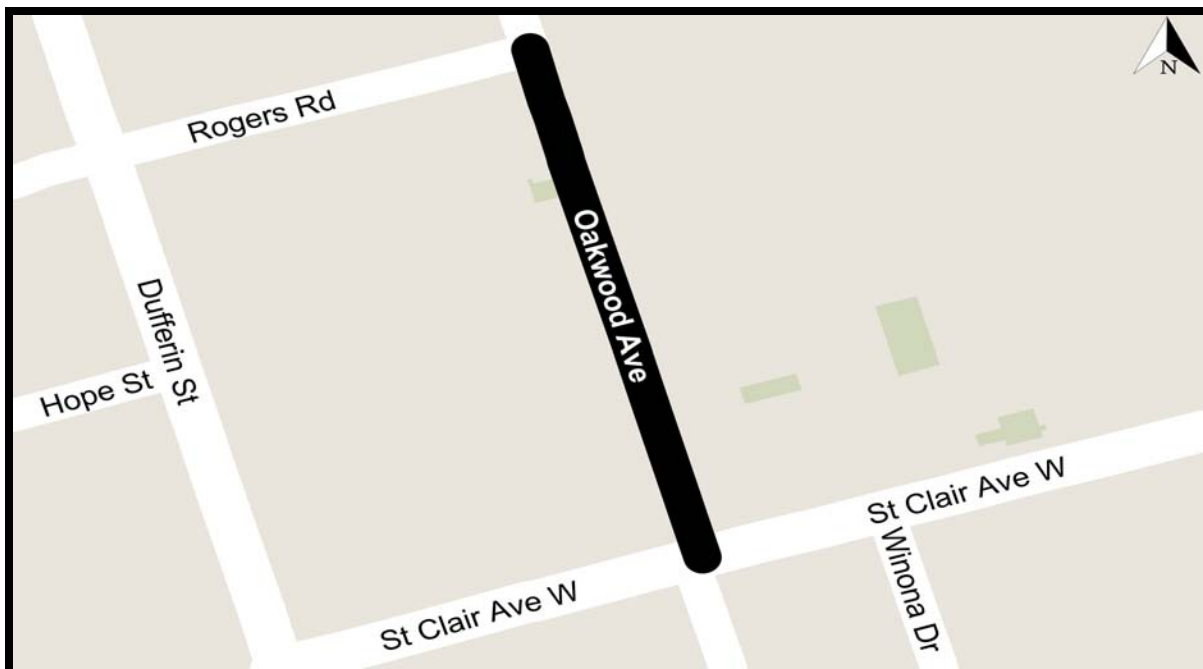
WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.

- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Planned Tree Planting: If you live in a property along Oakwood Avenue from Davenport Road to Rogers Road, the City will contact you to identify all available locations to plant trees to increase the Tree Canopy when the road resurfacing work is complete. The City has confirmed 32 locations for Tree planting that will take place in Spring 2017.</p>
