Free Snow Removal From City Sidewalks

If you are 65 years of age or older or under age 65 and have a physical disability, you can apply to have the City remove snow from the City sidewalk in front of your home. Please contact my office if you would like an application sent to you.

Toronto Renovates Program for Seniors or People With a Disability

The City offers a home repair program known as "Toronto Renovates" for low-income homeowners who are seniors or persons living with a disability. For more information, please feel free to contact my office.

Basement Flooding Protection Subsidy Program

Help protect yourself against basement flooding. This program assists homeowners by offering owners of single family, duplex and triplex residential homes a financial subsidy of up to \$3,200 per property to install flood protection devices.

Take steps to prevent frozen pipes this winter

The pipes in your home can freeze in cold weather. This can leave you with no water or cause your pipes to burst, leading to expensive property damage. Here are a few helpful tips to prevent your pipes from freezing.

Know your Pipes: Ensure you know where the main water shut-off valve is in your home and how it operates.



Insulate Pipes: Wrap foam pipe insulation around pipes most at risk, especially near outside walls and in crawl spaces, the attic and garage.

Eliminate Drafts: Seal air leaks in your home and garage to stop cold air from getting in. Check around windows and doors, electrical wiring, dryer vents and pipes.

Drain and Shut the Outdoor Water Supply: Outdoor faucets are the first to freeze. Unscrew any hoses, turn off the outdoor water supply valve and let it drain.

Winter is Coming...Be nice... clear your ice!

- The City clears snow from local roads after a snow accumulation of 8 cm.
- In the City, property owners are required to clear their sidewalks of snow 12 hours after a snowfall has taken place.
- Please don't push snow onto the road as it is illegal, hampers snow clearing efforts by the City, takes up parking spots, and is very dangerous for motorists and pedestrians.
- Some senior citizens and people with physical disabilities may be entitled to free snow removal from public sidewalks fronting their homes. For more information regarding this program please contact my office.
- If you need help in clearing snow from your private property, the York-Fairbank Centre for Seniors will clear snow, however, you have to apply for the service by calling them at 416-651-8300. There is a small charge for the snow removal on private property.
